



READING PATHFINDER

This report provides a number of reading titles to consider as part of plans for your child's reading this year. According to your child's performance, any of these titles should provide an appropriate level of reading challenge, and are representative of a range of the types of material that your child can read successfully. Librarians, bookstore owners, and others can help you locate similar books that match your student's interests and are at an appropriate reading level.

A Lexile measure refers to text readability only – therefore parents and educators are encouraged to preview books that a child reads to make sure they are at the appropriate developmental level for the child and also meet community standards. The letters E, M, and H denote Elementary (K-5), Middle (6-8) and High School (9-12) respectively and are a general guide to the normal location of these titles.
